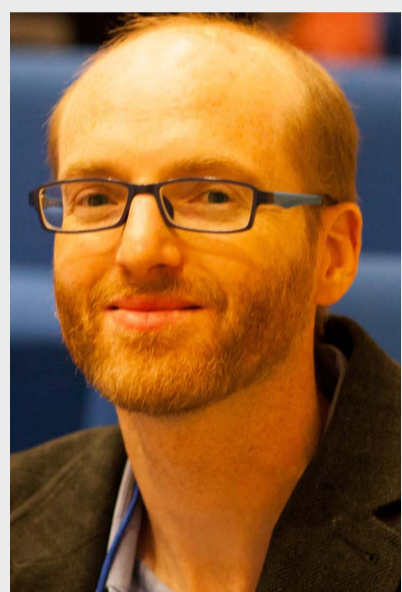


**Dr. Ziv Bohrer, Bar-Ilan University**

## **Temporary Legislation, Better Regulation and Experimentalist Governance: An Empirical Study**

Dr. Ittai Bar-Siman-Tov is an Assistant Professor at Bar Ilan University Faculty of Law. Before joining Bar Ilan's Law Faculty, he was an Associate-in-Law at Columbia Law School. He has previously served as a senior law clerk for Justice Dorit Beinisch at the Supreme Court of Israel, and as research assistant to Professor Menahem Elon, former deputy Chief-Justice of the Supreme Court of Israel. Dr. Bar-Siman-Tov obtained his J.S.D. and LL.M. from Columbia Law School, where he was a James Kent Scholar, Fulbright Scholar, Fischman Scholar, and Morris Fellow. He received his LL.B., magna cum laude, from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. Dr. Bar-Siman-Tov's research interests include constitutional law; constitutional theory; legislation; jurisprudence; and judicial review.

## **Police Militarization and The Presumption of Threat**

Eliav Lieblich is a senior lecturer at Tel-Aviv University's Faculty of Law. He earned his J.S.D. and LL.M. degrees from Columbia Law School, where he was a recipient of the Norman E. Alexander Fellowship, and an LL.B. from Hebrew University, where he also earned a degree in Islamic and Middle Eastern studies. Lieblich teaches and researches public international law, with a focus on the laws on the use of force, international humanitarian law, and the history and theory of international law. In recent years, he participated as an expert in various international forums, such as the ICRC's expert group on proportionality and the CCW's expert meeting on autonomous weapons systems.

Dr. Adam Shinar is an assistant professor at the Radzyner Law School in the Interdisciplinary Center Herzliya (IDC). He earned his S.J.D. and LL.M. from Harvard Law School, where he also served as the Clark Byse Fellow, and his LL.B from the Hebrew University in Jerusalem. He clerked for the President of the Israeli Supreme Court, Aharon Barak, and worked as an attorney for several human rights NGOs in Israel and India. His main areas of interest are constitutional law and theory, administrative law, and labor law. In particular, his recent projects have focused on dissent inside the state, free speech, public service reforms and privatization, the rule of law, and the sociology of Israeli constitutional law.
